Crematoria in England and Wales - Policies

Retention of Ashes Policy

To help provide reassurance to families that ashes that are left at a crematorium during the pandemic period are being well cared for, DMAG has revised their <u>Retention of Ashes Policy</u>. It is recommended that where it is not possible for collection to be arranged, the crematorium should ensure that ashes are stored securely at the crematorium. It is recognised that some families may receive a therapeutic benefit from having the ashes, so if it can be arranged the ashes can be released in line with the instruction of the Applicant.
