





ICCM OrthoMetals recycling scheme. The past, the present and the future

Trevor Robson of ICCM and Hidde Verberne of OrthoMetals BV

Trevor and Hidde will give a detailed overview of the ICCM Orthometals recycling scheme. From being the first to start recycling metals with only a few members participating the scheme has evolved to a standard setting scheme with more than 180 members participating. The revenues that are currently generated support many local charities. ICCM's unique approach has created solidarity amongst the members and makes sure all the benefits are donated to charitable causes. The scheme is often set as an example for government bodies all over the world to deal with the sensitivity of this subject. Being innovative and open for change also means that it is good to discuss the current working methods. Hidde and Trevor will outline the current way of working to make sure it is clear how it works now.

Trevor says: In 2001 I graduated with a first class Honours degree in Business Systems and IT before being employed as an Energy Analyst for Northern Electric. Shortly after this I became a Statistical Support Officer for Durham County Council.

Having offered IT assistance to the previous Treasurer of ICCM, I became the ICCM Finance and IT Manager (FITM) in 2006.

Since 2006 I have been responsible for the financial reporting and well-being of ICCM and advising the Board on all appropriate matters.

As FITM, all matters relating to the donations of the ICCM/Orthometals recycling of metals scheme have been within my role and its subsequent he development over the last 16 years

Hidde says:

In 2003 I finished a study in Logistics and Economics I started working for a transportation company. After three years I was appointed as director of that company and used the next few years to grow the business and I also learned a lot during the challenging times around the 2008 crisis. In 2013 my father asked me to join Orthometals. In 2015 my father retired, and from that day myself and Jan Willem are leading the company. We are proud that we have grown Orthiometals to a world marketleader, being active in 4 continents and working for more then 1400 crematoria worldwide. At this moment we employ over 30 people who have joined us in making and keeping OrthoMetals an innovative and efficient company.

The Lost Generation: the problem of scattering ashes in the modern era Richard Martin of Scattering Ashes

Since records began, we have known the final resting place of every person. Over the last 50 years this has changed, now we know about only a fraction of where people are laid to rest. The practice of scattering a person's ashes has increased year on year since the late sixties and now it is the most common choice.

This paper looks at reason why people scatter and scale of the issue, and what can be to help the general public in their choice of memorialisation.

Richard is: Founder of the leading website for advice on cremation ashes Scattering Ashes, Richard has been blogging and speaking about cremated remains for 12 years.

He has written articles on social trends, cultural differences, legislative rulings, celebrity choices as well as pretty much everything else related to ashes.

His research work has focussed on where you can and cannot scatter ashes; from football grounds to National Trust properties.

Richard's background is in the environment with over 25 years at the Environment Agency and the Department for Farming and Rural Affairs. His understanding of the impact of cremated remains upon the land, the water and the air is based on his work across water, soil and air quality.

Considering Care in Funerals

Professor Vikki Entwistle of the University of Aberdeen

The Care in Funerals project and casebook

This presentation will provide a summary of findings from the Care in Funerals project and give convention participants an opportunity to discuss a scenario from the Care in Funerals casebook, which is being developed as a resource to support reflection on the practical-ethical issues that can arise in different areas of funeral provision.

The Care in Funerals project investigated experiences of funeral provision during the COVID-19 pandemic. In part, we were interested in what people's responses to constraints on previous practices could tell us about what can matter, and why, about death rites in general and funerals in particular.

We interviewed a diverse sample of 68 people from around the UK, including people who had been bereaved, funeral officiants and celebrants, and funeral directors (broadly construed). We were careful to ensure representation from different faith groups and socio-economic backgrounds.

The project is documenting significant disruption and distress associated with the curtailment of various forms of death rites and funerals as efforts were made to limit the spread of COVID-19. It is also highlighting some determined and creative adaptations made in efforts to ensure respect and care for both the dead and the bereaved.

The interviews included numerous accounts of difficult situations and decisions, conflicting priorities and variations in practice which sometimes fell below what was considered acceptable. The relevance of many of the issues raised persists beyond the pandemic. The Care in Funerals casebook is intended to facilitate consideration of these, including in the context of professional development. We will briefly introduce a sample case and invite discussion and comment – both during the session and afterwards to careinfunerals@abdn.ac.uk.

Vikki Entwistle is a Professor at the University of Aberdeen. In her research, teaching and learning, she seeks to understand and address concerns about quality, ethics and social justice in health care, public health work and (more recently) funeral provision. Vikki is particularly interested in what are sometimes called person-centred approaches (you might prefer to talk about humanity in service provision) and how we can be appropriately responsive to diverse perspectives on what matters.

Following the untimely passing of my late husband and seven year old son and their organ and tissue donation, Believe was formed to educate and support those affected by organ donation with the overriding objective of removing organ donation as a taboo subject and valuing the gift of life.

Having qualified as a solicitor Anna-Louise became mum before the tragic incident on the $5^{th}/6^{th}$ December 2015. Form the support and belief that something positive could be born out of such tragedy, Anna-Louise founded Believe — organ donor support. She remains the (unpaid) CEO of the board of trustees and with the help of her ambassadors, trustees and part-time member of staff, has changed the education and support system in Wales.

To Be Or Not To Be a Business in the Disposal of the Dead

Ian Hussein, Advisor to Burial and Cremation Authorities

This paper considers commercialism in the disposal of the dead and the extent to which the public, charitable and private sectors provide services that are fit for purpose and whether they deliver value for money. This is done in context of the significant changes and challenges that bereavement related services have faced, including the growth of pre-paid funeral plans, the shortage of burial space, pressures on local government budgets, direct cremation and the impact that the disposal of the dead has upon the environment. Potential alternative operating models will be proposed to generate a wider debate and discussion in answering the question of whether to be or not to be a business in the disposal of the dead.

A Life Member and former Past National Secretary, Chairman and President of the ICCM, Ian has administered and managed cemeteries, crematoria and other bereavement related services for 38 years, including 13 years with the Commonwealth War Graves Commission working across Europe, the Middle East and North Africa.
